Bridging disconnect

Many young people - particularly those from marginalised groups - rarely see themselves represented in traditional heritage spaces, which often elevate certain stories at the expense of others.

The elders and custodians of knowledge should not gatekeep the heritage spaces.

Continuity and skills development

Efforts “beyond representation” should include programmes that equip youth with skills, resources, networks and support with projects across sectors while empowering other youth in their communities.

Be fearless in putting culture at the center of problem solving.



Research in AI & Communities

Balancing cultural authenticity as foundation to digital approach complementarily as continuation of heritage and culture [not disruption].

Intergenerational exchange can be forward-looking – youth brings energy, technology and perspective while elders bring memory, depth and wisdom.

This will ensure transmission of knowledge that is endangered. Digital tools are about participation and not preservation.
